NOTICE is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the Township of Harding for 2023 Lawn Care and related Maintenance Services for various Township properties at the Township of Harding Municipal Building, 21 Blue Mill Road, New Vernon, NJ 07976, on **Wednesday, March 8, 2023 at 10:00** a.m. Prevailing Time.

Specifications and forms of bids, contract, and bond for proposed work, are available at the Office of the Township Clerk commencing on Thursday, February 16, 2023, between the hours of 8:30 am and 4:00 pm. Upon request prospective bidders will be furnished a copy of the specifications. Bid Specifications are posted on the Municipal Web Page: www.hardingnj.org

Bids must be made on Standard Proposal Forms in the manner designated herein and required by the specifications, must be enclosed in sealed envelopes, bearing the name and address of bidder and name of project on the outside addressed to Township of Harding, Purchasing Agent, 21 Blue Mill Road, New Vernon, NJ 07976 and must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond for not less than ten (10%) percent of the amount bid, provided said check need not be more than \$20,000.00, nor shall not be less than \$500.00 and be delivered at the place on or before the hour named above.

The Standard Proposal Form and required documents to be submitted with the bid proposal are included with the Specifications. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A11-23.2, all contracts entered into with the Township of Harding, the contractor must be registered with the New Jersey Department of the Treasury, Division of Revenue and provide a business certificate with the bid. The contractor shall provide written notice to its subcontractors and supplier of the responsibility to submit proof of business registration to the contractor. The requirement of proof of business registration extends down through all levels of the project. Before final payment on the contract is made by the contracting agency, the contractor shall submit an accurate list and poof of business registration of each subcontractor or supplier used in the fulfillment of the contract, or shall attest that no subcontractors were used.

The Contractor will comply with rules and regulations and orders promulgated by the New Jersey State Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27 and will all provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A11-1 et. seq. and all rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference.

In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15(45), the Township reserves the right to award by resolution two (2) one (1) –year extensions. The Township reserves the right to determine which contract will be awarded and the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any informality in any bid, as permitted or required by law.

QUOTE ITEM #1: MEMORIAL PARK

A. TURF CARE

- 1. Mowing, trimming and clean-up of all finished turf areas with power equipment and trimmers. All turf areas will be scheduled to be mowed once a week, during growing season. During cool and wet weather, mowing frequency may increase. During hot, dry weather, mowing frequency may decrease.
- 2. Memorial Park must be moved during the week prior to Memorial Day.
- 3. A standard cutting height of 3" will be used under normal weather conditions. Mowing height may be increased during periods of drought.
- 4. String trimming to include areas around all existing trees and shrubs. Also, around and under a 11 benches, tables and fencing.
- 5. All fallen branches 3" diameter or smaller will be properly removed from property on scheduled day of lawn maintenance.

B. SPOT WEED CONTROL

- 1. Weed control of all required areas chemically and by hand. Areas include under benches and tables, plant beds and walk paths as required.
- 2. Memorial Park paths will be weeded the week prior to Memorial Day.
- 3. All beds throughout the park will be mulched and edged as required to maintain a neat appearance and maintain a depth of three (3) inches maximum. (The Township will provide mulch.) Provide one-time fee for mulch application.

C. TREE AND SHRUB CARE

- 1. Landscape trees and ornamentals will be pruned as needed during the season to remove dead wood and invasive growth.
- 2. All existing shrubs will be pruned to maintain shape and size as required.
- 3. All trimming will be done using a hand pruner.

D. SPRING CLEAN UP

- 1. Spring clean up to include the removal of accumulated leaves, sticks, and debris throughout Memorial Park.
- 2. Memorial Park Spring Clean Up will be performed prior to Memorial Day.
- 3. All debris will be removed from Memorial Park and disposed of properly.

QUOTE ITEM #2: BAYNE PARK

A. TURF CARE

- 1. Mowing, trimming and clean- up of all finished turf areas with power equipment and trimmers. All turf areas will be moved once every two weeks during growing season. During cool and wet weather, mowing frequency may increase. During hot, dry weather, mowing frequency may decrease. (Wide band (2'-3') of field grasses on the Blue Mill Rd side of pond to be left "as is" during growing season)
- 2. A standard cutting height of 4-1/4" will be used under normal weather conditions. Mowing height may be increased during periods of drought.
- 3. String trimming to include areas around all existing trees and shrubs. Also around and under all benches, tables and fencing.
- 4. All f alien branches 3" diameter or smaller will be properly removed from property on scheduled day of lawn maintenance
- 5. Mowing will be performed in such a manner as not to discharge grass clippings into or towards the streams, waterways or pond.

B. SPOT WEED CONTROL

1. Weed control of all required areas chemically and by hand. Areas include under benches and tables, plant beds and parking areas as required.

C. TREE AND SHRUB CARE

1. Landscape trees and Ornamentals will be pruned as needed during the season to remove dead wood and invasive growth.

D. SPRING CLEAN-UP

- 1. Spring clean up to include the removal of accumulated leaves, sticks and debris from throughout Bayne Park.
- 2. All debris will be removed from Bayne Park, and disposed of properly.
- 3. Center Island in parking area requires additional mulch to be placed when existing mulch depth is less than two (2) inches, not to exceed three (3) inches. Entrance sign area and center Island will be maintained as required to provide a neat appearance throughout the season. (The Township will provide the mulch.)
- 4. All dead growth along the stream from the pond dam inclusive of the spillway to the end of the park at the Blue Mill culvert shall be removed and properly disposed of from the property. All growth along the same will be trimmed at a height of 6" and properly removed from property prior to the growing season as determined by the Twp.'s DPW Superintendent.

E. FALL CLEAN UP

- 1. Fall clean up to include the removal of accumulated leaves, sticks and debris from throughout Bayne Park. Final fall clean-up will be performed after the majority of leaves have fallen.
- 2. Fallen Crab Apple leaves to be raked, bagged and removed.
- 3. All debris will be removed from Bayne Park and disposed of properly.
- 4. All growth along all streams and along the perimeter edge of the pond shall be cut back to a height of six (6) inches.
- 5. Perimeter pond Plantings- identified weeds and invasive growth removed.

F. STORM DAMAGE

G. GENERAL

1. Stone lot will be graded as needed to maintain safe passage at all times.

A. TURF CARE

- 3. Mowing height may be increased during periods of drought.
- 4. This proposal includes lawn areas along Brook Drive South to end of the Post and Rail fence. Lawn areas from the entrance drive to and including Baileys Mill Road ending at the Fire House.
- 5. All fallen branches 3" diameter or smaller will be properly removed from property on scheduled day of lawn maintenance.

B. SPOT WEED CONTROL

- 3. Mowing height may be increased during periods of drought.
- 4. All fallen branches 3" diameter or smaller will be properly removed from property on scheduled day of lawn maintenance.

B. SPOT WEED CONTROL

1. Weed control of all required areas chemically and by hand.

C. SPRING CLEAN UP

- 1. Springs clean up to include the removal of accumulated leaves, sticks and debris from throughout show grounds area.
- 2. All debris will be removed from the show grounds and disposed of properly.

D. FALL CLEAN UP

- 2. Final fall clean-up will be performed after the majority of leaves have fallen.
- 3. All debris will be removed from the show grounds, and disposed of properly.

E. STORM DAMAGE

A. TURF CARE

- 1. Mowing, trimming and clean-up of all finished turf areas with power equipment and trimmers. All turf areas will be scheduled to be mowed once a week during growing season. During cool and wet weather, mowing frequency may increase. During hot, dry weather, mowing frequency may decrease.
- 2. A standard cutting height of 3" will be used under normal weather conditions. Mowing height may be increased during periods of drought.
- 3. String trimming to include areas around all existing trees and shrubs. Also, around and under all benches, tables and fencing and walks.
- 4. All fallen branches 3" diameter or smaller will be properly removed from property on scheduled day of lawn maintenance.

- 2. All beds throughout the property will mulched and edged as required to maintain a neat appearances and maintain a depth of three (3) inches maximum. (The Township will provide the mulch.) Provide on-time fee for mulch application.

C. TREE AND SHRUB CARE

- 1. Landscape trees and ornamentals will be pruned as needed during the season to remove dead wood and invasive growth. All existing shrubs will be pruned to maintain shape and size as required.
- 2. All trimming will be done using a hand pruner.

D. SPRING CLEAN UP

1. Spring clean up to include the removal of accumulated leaves, sticks and debris from throughout the property. All debris will be removed from the property and disposed of properly.

Any variation to the specified schedule of mowing as directed under Turf Care (A) must be approved by the DPW Superintendent prior to service. All other services require prior authorization.



Temporary and Executing

12. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed as affecting the eligibility of any business entity to perform a public contract because that entity made a contribution to any committee during the one-year period immediately preceding the effective date of this act.

The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-1 et seq.)

19:44A-3 Definitions. In pertinent part...

p. The term "political party committee" means the State committee of a political party, as organized pursuant to R.S.19:5-4, any county committee of a political party, as organized pursuant to R.S.19:5-3, or any municipal committee of a political party, as organized pursuant to R.S.19:5-2.

q. The term "candidate committee" means a committee established pursuant to subsection a. of section 9 of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-9) for the purpose of receiving contributions and making expenditures.

r. the term "joint candidates committee" means a committee established pursuant to subsection a. of section 9 of P.L.1973, c.83 (C.19:44A-9) by at least two candidates for the same elective public offices in the same election in a legislative district, county, municipality or school district, but not more candidates than the total number of the same elective public offices to be filled in that election, for the purpose of receiving contributions and making expenditures. For the purpose of this subsection: ...; the offices of member of the board of chosen freeholders and county executive shall be deemed to be the same elective public offices in a county; and the offices of mayor and member of the municipal governing body shall be deemed to be the same elective public offices in a municipality.

19:44A-8 and 16 Contributions, expenditures, reports, requirements.

While the provisions of this section are too extensive to reprint here, the following is deemed to be the pertinent part affecting amounts of contributions:

"The \$300 limit established in this subsection shall remain as stated in this subsection without further adjustment by the commission in the manner prescribed by section 22 of P.L.1993, c.65 (C.19:44A-7.2)

C. 271 POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION DISCLOSURE FORM Contractor Instructions

Business entities (contractors) receiving contracts from a public agency that are NOT awarded pursuant to a "fair and open" process (defined at N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7) are subject to the provisions of P.L. 2005, c. 271, s.2 (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26). This law provides that 10 days prior to the award of such a contract, the contractor shall disclose contributions to:

- any State, county, or municipal committee of a political party
- any legislative leadership committee*
- any continuing political committee (a.k.a., political action committee)
- any candidate committee of a candidate for, or holder of, an elective office:
 - o of the public entity awarding the contract
 - o of that county in which that public entity is located
 - o of another public entity within that county
 - o or of a legislative district in which that public entity is located or, when the public entity is a county, of any legislative district which includes all or part of the county

The disclosure must list reportable contributions to any of the committees that exceed \$300 per election cycle that were made during the 12 months prior to award of the contract. See N.J.S.A. 19:44A-8 and 19:44A-16 for more details on reportable contributions.

N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 itemizes the parties from whom contributions must be disclosed when a business entity is not a natural person. This includes the following:

- individuals with an "interest" ownership or control of more than 10% of the profits or assets of a business entity or 10% of the stock in the case of a business entity that is a corporation for profit
- all principals, partners, officers, or directors of the business entity or their spouses
- any subsidiaries directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity
- IRS Code Section 527 New Jersey based organizations, directly or indirectly controlled by the business entity and filing as continuing political committees, (PACs).

When the business entity is a natural person, "a contribution by that person's spouse or child, residing therewith, shall be deemed to be a contribution by the business entity." [N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26(b)] The contributor must be listed on the disclosure.

Any business entity that fails to comply with the disclosure provisions shall be subject to a fine imposed by ELEC in an amount to be determined by the Commission which may be based upon the amount that the business entity failed to report.

The enclosed list of agencies is provided to assist the contractor in identifying those public agencies whose elected official and/or candidate campaign committees are affected by the disclosure requirement. It is the contractor's responsibility to identify the specific committees to which contributions may have been made and need to be disclosed. The disclosed information may exceed the minimum requirement.

The enclosed form, a content-consistent facsimile, or an electronic data file containing the required details (along with a signed cover sheet) may be used as the contractor's submission and is disclosable to the public under the Open Public Records Act.

The contractor must also complete the attached Stockholder Disclosure Certification. This will assist the agency in meeting its obligations under the law. **NOTE: This section does not apply to Board of Education contracts.**

* N.J.S.A. 19:44A-3(s): "The term "legislative leadership committee" means a committee established, authorized to be established, or designated by the President of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly or the Minority Leader of the General Assembly pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1993, c.65 (C.19:44A-10.1) for the purpose of receiving contributions and making expenditures."
