DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Bayne Park

Mr. DeNave, Assistant Administrator reported that Ms. Donna Wilson a member of CPAC has assembled information pertaining to Bayne Park. WHEREAS, the Township of Harding has the need on a timely basis to purchase goods or services utilizing State, Morris County Cooperative contracts, Somerset County Cooperative contracts, Union County Cooperative contracts, Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission Cooperative Pricing System contracts, or the Cranford Police Cooperative Pricing System; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Harding intends to enter into contracts with the attached referenced State, Morris County Cooperative Contract, the Somerset County Cooperative Contract, Union County Cooperative Contract, and the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission Cooperative Pricing System Vendors through this resolution and properly executed contracts, which shall be subject to all the conditions applicable to the current State, Morris, Somerset and Middlesex County Cooperative contracts, and Cranford Police Cooperative Pricing System.
