DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. HPC – 88 Glen Alpin – T. dePoortere / G. Claytor

Mr. dePoortere reported to the Township Committee that HPC met on June 6, 2023 which started the discussion of the 88 Glen Alpin application. A site inspection was conducted on June 10, 2023. On July 6, 2023, HPC continued the discussion on the 88 Glen Alpin application. Mr. dePoortere explained that there was a subdivision in 2001 with historic easement. The site which is 2.4 acres is a contributing site in the Mc Cabe study. The applicant would like to keep the compound. Mayor Jones commented how many lot are there. Mr. dePoortere responded there are two more lots. HPC would like the applicant to keep the compound. The existing structures are: chicken coop, garage, accessory dwelling, and main dwelling. The proposed use is as follows:

- Chicken Coop rebuild it studio/shed. HPC had no issues with the proposed changes.
- Garage would like dormers. HPC questioned the need for dormers.
- Accessory Dwelling applicant would like to convert this structure into a pool house. HPC had no issued with the proposed changes.
- Main Dwelling applicant would like to demolish the main dwelling, raise the roof. HPC had concerns with massing of proposed new home. The replacement with a large home, having a singular ridge line to gain high ceiling heights, in place of the existing lower varying roof lines will negatively impact the Glen Alpin streetscape. HPC suggested that the applicant would entertain amending the architectural plans to include animated rooflines of various roof heights to achieve the farmhouse style of the new home. HPC had concerns with how to conform to the existing easement.

Mr. Edwards, Township Attorney, will review the easement documents and get back to the applicants attorney.

Resolution TC 23-130 – A Shared Services Agreement by and Between the Township of Harding and the Township of Long Hill Relative to the Services of the Harding Township Administrator Robert Falzarano for Assessment, Report, and Recommendations in Relation to the Long Hill Township Police Department

WHEREAS, Harding has in its employ a certain individual known as Robert Falzarano who has been appointed as the Township Administrator for the Township of Harding; and

WHEREAS, Harding has agreed to permit Mr. Falzarano to act as a consultant for the Township of Long Hill in addition to his duties assigned by Harding to Mr. Falzarano as an employee of Harding; and

WHEREAS, Long Hill has agreed to pay Harding Township a fee of \$10,000.00 upon delivery of the final report for the assessment and evaluation of the administrative operations, facilities, and staffing functions of its police department; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Long Hill has agreed to pay Harding Township an additional sum of \$4,000.00 per month for a period of five years or, until the parties mutually agree that Mr. Falzarano's services are no longer required in the Township of Long Hill; and

WHEREAS, Harding and Long Hill seek to outline the duties and obligations of each party pertaining to Mr. Falzarano's services through a shared services agreement as outlined in N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, *et. seq.*; and

WHEREAS, Harding seeks to authorize the execution of the shared services agreement.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Harding (the "<u>Committee</u>") that subject to the following conditions:

1. The Committee hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor, or his/her designee to execute the Shared Services Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, subject to any minor revisions from Counsel.

Resolution TC 23-131 – Resolution Extending the Conditional Redeveloper Designation and Authorizing the Execution of an Amendment to the Conditional Redeveloper Designation and Escrow Agreement with Glen Alpin Preservation Partners, LLC

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to authorize the execution of an amendment to the Conditional Redeveloper Designation and Escrow Agreement with Glen Alpin Preservation Partners, LLC to permit the parties to continue negotiations of a redevelopment agreement for the Glen Alpin Property.
